Rural Housing Needs: FINANCING

ACCESS

Portland Metro area has more access to funding than rural areas

SOURCES OF FUNDING & REQUESTS

- 1. Increase of 9% Tax Credits. Due to the increase on construction costs (inflation), all the 9% Tax Credits have been allocated to projects with gaps and that were awarded 2022 credits, leaving 2023 with a gap.
- 2. Returning the Farmworker Tax Credit to stand alone and not as part of the small NOFA or at least strongly consider allowing culturally responsive organizations who have a history of serving farm workers, to be able to access AWHTC in early 2023. And these tax credits should be made available before the LIFT NOFA.
- 3. Increasing the LIFT subsidy limits because of rising construction costs and interest rates. Increases should be between 12-15 % to go along with inflation. Higher LIFT subsidies for communities that don't have access to other gap funding.
- 4. Expedite the CARE program to get dollars out the door to projects that are contemplating co-locating housing with early learning centers. This has been on the table for almost a year, we need to have a plan in place to access this money.


OPPORTUNITIES & ACCESS

Oregon Housing and Community Services (OHCS), local cities, and housing authorities must give priorities to non-profit affordable housing owners.



ACCESS

Cities and Municipalities in rural areas should be encouraged to work with non-profit owners, and culturally specific CDCs when land is available.



Opportunity to create cross-sector and mission-oriented partners for life that will reinvest their developer fees into programs that seek to break the cycle of poverty to underinvested in communities.
