SUBJECT: 2023 Committee LC Summaries - Revised

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| LC 2063 | Increases minimum to 10-point type size for instruments presented for recording to county clerks. |
| LC 2066 | Exempts certified copies of a death record from County Assessment and Taxation Fund recording fee. Declares emergency, effective on passage. |
| LC 2067 | Renames “board of property tax appeals” to “property value appeals board.” |
| LC 2069 | Expands eligibility for domestic partnership under the Oregon Family Fairness Act to partners of any sex. |
| LC 2071 | Clarifies method of collecting unpaid charges against real property if instrument conveying fee title to such real property to exempt entity is recorded without certificate issued by county assessor attesting that all charges have been paid. |
| LC 2258 | Prohibits members of Legislative Assembly from participating in discussion or debate if actual conflict of interest exists. Prohibits members from voting on issue when actual conflict of interest exists unless vote is necessary to establish quorum. |
| LC 2261 | Requires Oregon Government Ethics Commission to study how to improve efficacy of Oregon’s government ethics laws and report to Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2024. (Placeholder) |
| LC 2266 | Requires Oregon Government Ethics Commission to study public meetings law and practices in Oregon and submit findings to Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2024. (Placeholder) |

- LC 2276 Requires Public Records Advisory Council to study public records law and practices and submit findings to the Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2024. (Placeholder)
- LC 2293 Requires a statement of economic interest (SEI) that lists positions as an officer of a business and business directorships held by the public official or candidate, or member of household of public official or candidate, to include certain information about sources of income received by those businesses, if the source of the income has or could reasonably be expected to have a legislative or administrative interest, and 10 percent or more of the total gross annual income of the business comes from that source of income. Allows public official or candidate to keep confidential certain information if public official or candidate makes a formal request to each source of income asking for permission to make the required disclosure; files a signed statement with the Oregon Government Ethics Commission regarding the request; and reports each source of income that responds to the formal request within 10 business days. Adds same SEI requirement for each source of income for all names under which the public official or candidate and members of the household of the public official or candidate do business. Prohibits candidate or principal campaign committee of candidate from expending campaign moneys for professional services rendered by a business required to be listed on the candidate's SEI. Exempts certain expenditures.
- LC 2628 Extends time after special district territory election for entry of order and return of deposits.
- LC 2636 Removes the requirement to conduct second recount for batches of ballots already subject to recount and the requirement to conduct either a hand recount or risk-limiting audit for an election where recount is separately required by law.
