







Total Fall Undergraduate Headcounts Year-Over-Year Percent Change



WHAT WILL HELP?

- Pipeline It all starts with K-12 graduation rates and a focus on the importance of a college education
- Creative investments More ideas like the Tribal Student Grant
- Funding Continue to fund OOG as ability to pay continues to be the major barrier, and consider expanding it so it has the same buying power as the Oregon Promise. Currently, non-Pell Grant eligible students with financial need cannot afford four-year universities in Oregon
- **Support** Continue programs like Strong Start so that students who were affected by learning in the pandemic are not starting behind
