HB 2089

HB 2589

(1:15 pm) Requires public institutions of higher education to bypass developmental educational requirements and placement tests for each student who receives grade on approved high school equivalency test indicating student is fully qualified to bypass requirements and tests.

HB 2868

(1:35 pm) Establishes minimum education requirements for teachers of certain accelerated college credit program courses.

HB 2919

(1:50 pm) Requires each public university and community college to prominently display total costs of all required course materials and fees for no less than 75 percent of total courses offered by public university or community college.

HB 2542

(2:05 pm) Requires each public university and community college to prominently display mandatory fees charged.

HB 3012

(2:20 pm) Limits ability of public university to refuse new mandatory incidental fees or process for collecting mandatory incidental fees.
