- HB 3255  
Directs education employer to provide materials and assistance to eligible employees concerning public service loan forgiveness program.
- HB 2537 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Allows school districts to use moneys distributed from Student Investment Account for payment of student fees, costs and instructors of career and technical student organization programs.
- HB 2989  
Establishes state policy that career and technical education is provided through seamless system that begins at secondary school level and progresses to post-secondary career and technical education institutions, community colleges and apprenticeship programs.
