HB 2165 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Transportation then to Ways and Means (1:05 pm) Requires electric companies to collect amount from all retail electricity consumers, to be expended to support transportation electrification pursuant to plan accepted by Public Utility Commission.

HB 2476

(1:05 pm) Authorizes Public Utility Commission to allow electric companies to recover costs from retail electricity consumers for prudent infrastructure measures to support transportation electrification if certain criteria are met.

HB 2180

(2:00 pm) Requires Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to amend state building code to require that new construction of certain buildings include provisions for electrical service capacity for specified percentage of parking spaces.

HB 2062

(2:20 pm) Establishes energy efficiency standards for certain appliances sold or offered for sale in this state.
