HB 2479

(1:05 pm) Modifies definition of "global warming" to include certain aerosol air contaminants, including black carbon.

HB 2398

(1:10 pm) Requires Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to ensure that statewide Reach Code mandates achievement of not more than 90 percent of site energy use that other statewide residential and commercial building codes require.

(1:30 pm) Commemorates 50th anniversary of Oregon Bottle Bill.

HB 3181

(1:45 pm) Requires Oregon Utility Notification Center to adopt rules requiring paint used for marking underground facilities to be temporary marking paint or other industry-accepted low-impact marking and requiring operators to remove markings that continue to be visible on private property after reasonable period has passed since excavation is complete.

HB 3269

(2:05 pm) Directs Department of Environmental Quality to study and develop strategies to fund department's emergency response program.

HB 3278

(2:25 pm) Directs State Department of Fish and Wildlife, in consultation with Department of State Lands and State Parks and Recreation Department, to study potential for developing commercial seaweed production to produce feed for livestock as means to reduce methane emissions.
