HB 2519

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 03-23-2021 MEETING: (3:20pm) Allows delivery of marijuana items, pursuant to bona fide orders, to consumers within city or county in which marijuana retailer is located and to consumers in cities or counties that have adopted ordinances allowing for delivery of marijuana items from adjacent cities or counties.

- HB 3197 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means CARRIED OVER FROM THE 03-23-2021 MEETING: (3:25pm) Requires marijuana testing laboratory employee to obtain worker permit from Oregon Liquor Control Commission.
- HB 2788

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 03-23-2021 MEETING: (3:30pm) Prohibits Department of Justice from charging officers and agencies of state government for assistance rendered.

Public Hearing

HB 3245

(3:35 pm) Authorizes eligible business to deliver malt beverages, wine or cider to final consumer through use of delivery person.

HB 3000

(4:05 pm) Directs Oregon Liquor Control Commission to study cannabis.

HB 3013

(4:20 pm) Directs Oregon Liquor Control Commission to study regulation of cannabis.

HB 3344

(4:30 pm) Specifies that required deposit to Oregon Liquor Control Commission of moneys from retail sale of distilled liquor by appointed agent is determined by retail sales in cash.

Work Session

HB 2264

(4:45 pm) Directs Oregon Liquor Control Commission to study alcohol.

Neither registration nor use of the public access kiosk is a guarantee that you will be able to testify during the meeting. Committee chairs may determine that public testimony must be limited. For this reason, written testimony is encouraged even if you plan to speak.

Unless otherwise noted on the agenda, testimony is only accepted by committees for bills or topics scheduled for a public hearing. See the Oregon Legislature's website for information on contacting individual legislators directly on bills or topics not scheduled for a public hearing.
