HB 3307

HB 2646

(3:30 pm) Establishes regulations for kratom products, including labeling requirements and minimum age for sale.

HB 3371 **

(3:40 pm) Requires Department of State Lands to consider potential risks in entering into agreements for authorized use of submerged and submersible lands and allows department to require risk mitigation or insurance.

HB 2758
