HB 2044

Allows Department of Consumer and Business Services to access data in All Payer All Claims database by certifying data will only be used to carry out department's duties.

HB 2508

Requires Oregon Health Authority to ensure reimbursement of health services delivered using telemedicine.

HB 2910 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Oregon Health Authority, upon receipt of federal approval, to assess fee on emergency medical services providers and use fee to reimburse costs of emergency medical services transports.

HB 2261

Prohibits remote sales of inhalant delivery systems.

HB 2965

Extends deadline for local plans for applying foundational capabilities and implementing foundational programs related to public health to December 31, 2025.

Increases fees for licenses for home health agencies.

(3:35 pm) CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-18-2021 MEETING: Allows mobile school-based health centers to qualify for safety net grants from Oregon Health Authority.

HB 2464

(3:50 pm) CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3-18-2021 MEETING: Allows person employed by health care facility to practice surgical technology if person is enrolled in or has completed specified apprenticeship program.

HB 2623

(4:15 pm) Limits cost-sharing for health benefit plan coverage of insulin prescribed for treatment of diabetes.

HB 2958

(4:30 pm) Allows pharmacist to prescribe and dispense preexposure prophylactic antiretroviral drug to patient after completion of patient assessment.

HB 2376

(4:45 pm) Requires health care provider who prescribes opioid to offer prescription for naloxone, or similar drug, and educational material under specified circumstances.

Note change: HB 2622, HB 3036, HB 2359, HB 2462 and HB 2528 have been removed. Times have been updated for HB 2591, HB 2464, HB 2623, HB 2958 and HB 2376.
