SB 39 A

Amends definition of "practice of nursing." Changes deadline for renewal of nursing licenses and nurses' authority to prescribe.

SB 40

Requires clinical component in nursing education for licensure by indorsement.

SB 98

Authorizes Board of Medical Imaging to issue letter of reprimand or impose probation for purposes of discipline.

SB 99

Allows Board of Medical Imaging designee to perform inspections related to medical imaging and X-ray machines.

SB 100

Allows Board of Medical Imaging to issue subpoena over signature of board executive director when conducting investigation.

SB 124

Adds certified speech-language pathology assistant to membership of State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology.

Public Hearing

SB 711 A

(3:30 pm) Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to study cost differences in hormone replacement drugs used by men and hormone replacement drugs used by women and report findings to Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2022.

SB 199 A

(4:10 pm) Modifies laws relating to form of advance directive.

SB 748 A

(4:35 pm) Requires Public Employees' Benefit Board, Oregon Educators Benefit Board and private insurers to provide insurance coverage to adult disabled children of insureds under certain circumstances.

Note change: SB 199 and SB 748 have been added.
