Public Hearing

SB 764 A

Provides that court must presume that resolution agreement that ends dispute over alleged infringement of patent or violation of other protection for protected drug has anticompetitive effects if alleged infringer receives item of value as part of or in connection with resolution agreement or if alleged infringer agrees to limit or stop researching, developing, manufacturing, marketing or selling competing drug.

Please note: SB 764 A is scheduled solely for the purpose of hearing testimony from the people who previously signed up to testify at the meeting on 5-18-2021.

SB 711 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5-18-2021 MEETING: Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to study cost differences in hormone replacement drugs used by men and

hormone replacement drugs used by women and report findings to Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2022.

SB 2

Prohibits insurers from imposing prior authorization or other utilization review requirements on coverage of proton beam therapy that do not apply to coverage of radiation therapy.

SB 3

Requires health benefit plans to cover emergency medical services transports.

SB 629

Allows pharmacist to use telepharmacy to deliver pharmacy services to patient at remote location.

SB 558 A

Prohibits insurance policy or contract that provides coverage for prescription drug to require prescription for drug prescribed for medical assistance recipient to be filled or refilled at mail order pharmacy or to require prescription to be filled or refilled at pharmacy that is not local and enrolled in medical assistance program.

SB 764 A

Provides that court must presume that resolution agreement that ends dispute over alleged infringement of patent or violation of other protection for protected drug has anticompetitive effects if alleged infringer receives item of value as part of or in connection with resolution agreement or if alleged infringer agrees to limit or stop researching, developing, manufacturing, marketing or selling competing drug.

SB 748 A

Requires Public Employees' Benefit Board, Oregon Educators Benefit Board and private insurers to provide insurance coverage to adult disabled children of insureds under certain circumstances.

SB 199 A

Modifies laws relating to form of advance directive.

SB 219 A

Directs Advance Directive Adoption Committee to submit report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary and health with recommendations for development, adoption and administration of statewide advance directive registry for collection and dissemination of advance directives.

Note change: SB 560 A has been removed. A public hearing for SB 764 A and a work session for SB 711 A have been added.
