Requires Portland State University Homelessness Research and Action Collaborative to study long-term rent assistance and to report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2022.

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Authorizes Housing and Community Services Department to grant moneys to nonprofit organization for ADU community pilot programs that develop accessory dwelling units for income-eligible homeowners and that are available for lease by income-eligible tenants.

HB 2007 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Authorizes Housing and Community Services Department to provide grants, loans and technical assistance to organizations increasing homeownership program access to underserved communities, including persons of color.

HB 3368 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Establishes shared-equity homeownership pilot program within Housing and Community Services Department.
