- SB 280  
Modifies provisions relating to criminal records checks performed by Department of Human Services and Oregon Health Authority.

Directs Governor's Child Foster Care Advisory Commission to establish Child Welfare Equity Advisory Committee to advise the commission and Department of Human Services regarding equitable provision of child welfare services.

HB 2826 \*\*

Modifies allocation formula for grants to children's advocacy centers.

HB 2830 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs University of Oregon to conduct Oregon child abuse prevalence study and to submit report regarding study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to human services.
