Work Session

HB 2155

Modifies definition of "public or private official" for purposes of mandatory child abuse reporting.

HB 3071

Modifies definition of "public or private official" with mandatory duty to report suspected abuse to include all state and local elected officials.

HB 2749

Permits school board to designate school employee to receive mandatory child abuse reports. HB 2751

Prohibits Department of Human Services from disclosing records and reports related to child abuse investigations to certain entities unless court finds report of abuse is founded.

HB 2754 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Appropriates moneys to Department of Human Services to fund existing contracted domestic violence specialist positions in child welfare offices.

HB 2826 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Modifies allocation formula for grants to children's advocacy centers.

HB 2830 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Directs University of Oregon to conduct Oregon child abuse prevalence study and to submit report regarding study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to human services.

HB 2424 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Department of Human Services, in consultation with Oregon Youth Authority and Oregon Health Authority, to develop child-caring agency grant and training program.
