HB 2155

Modifies definition of "public or private official" for purposes of mandatory child abuse reporting.

HB 3071

Modifies definition of "public or private official" with mandatory duty to report suspected abuse to include all state and local elected officials.

HB 2754 **

Appropriates moneys to Department of Human Services to fund existing contracted domestic violence specialist positions in child welfare offices.

HB 2424 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Department of Human Services, in consultation with Oregon Youth Authority and Oregon Health Authority, to develop child-caring agency grant and training program.
