HB 2964 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Department of Human Services to reimburse cost of care provided in residential training facilities and residential training homes in amounts sufficient to allow facilities and homes to pay direct support professional 150 percent of state minimum wage.

HB 2348

Requires hospitals and long term care facilities to make available to patients, residents, staff and visitors plant-based meals and beverages.

HB 2102

Requires Department of Human Services to report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to human services any changes needed to statutes governing programs administered by department due to changes to budget.
