HB 2036

Authorizes State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision to discharge person from parole or post-prison supervision prior to end of supervision term for specified medical reason if compatible with best interests of person and community.

HB 2047

Modifies authority of Department of Corrections to receive, hold and dispose of property. HB 2048

Requires court to send to Department of Corrections certified copy of order setting aside conviction.
