HB 2481

Prohibits law enforcement agencies from receiving certain military surplus equipment from federal government.

HB 2942 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Education

Removes certain nonviolent crimes from list of crimes that automatically make person ineligible to hold license or registration issued by Teacher Standards and Practices Commission if person has been convicted of crime.

Please note: HB 2513, HB 2928, and HB 2986 are scheduled solely for the purpose of committee discussion.

HB 2513

Requires police officers to be trained in airway and circulatory anatomy and physiology and certified in cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

HB 2928

Regulates use of chemical incapacitants, kinetic impact projectiles and sound devices by law enforcement agencies.

HB 2986

Requires Board on Public Safety Standards and Training to ensure that police officers and certified reserve officers are trained to investigate, identify and report crimes motivated by prejudice based on perceived gender of victim.

Note change: HB 2172 Public Hearing removed. Added Work Session on HB 2942.
