HB 3059

Repeals statute authorizing law enforcement officers to command dispersal of unlawful assemblies and arrest participants who do not disperse.

HB 3145 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to establish publicly available database of certain information about misconduct and discipline of public safety employees established by department.

HB 3273

Prohibits law enforcement agency from releasing booking photo except in specified circumstances.

HB 3355

Specifies identification required on uniforms of law enforcement officers working in crowd management.

HB 2162

Directs Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to study changes to police officer training and to provide results of study to Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2021.

HB 2513

Requires police officers to be trained in airway and circulatory anatomy and physiology and certified in cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

HB 2575

Directs Department of Justice to establish program for awarding grants to law enforcement agencies and local governments for training of groups and agencies that interact with persons who have experienced trauma.

HB 2928

Regulates use of chemical incapacitants, kinetic impact projectiles and sound devices by law enforcement agencies.

HB 2929

Modifies police officer's duty to report misconduct.

HB 2930

Imposes limitations on arbitrators' decisions concerning alleged misconduct by law enforcement officers.

HB 2932

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to establish statewide database of reports of use of physical force by peace officers and corrections officers.

HB 2936

Requires Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to investigate person's character before accepting person for training and certification as police officer or reserve officer.

HB 3047

Establishes civil cause of action for improper disclosure of personal information.

HB 3164

Modifies crime of interfering with a peace officer or parole and probation officer.
