#### **Public Hearing**

SB 298

(1:05 - 1:25 pm) Conforms language in provisions relating to stalking protective order to language used in other provisions relating to protective orders.

SB 190 A

(1:25 - 1:45 pm) Modifies permissible methods of providing notice of appointment of guardian to protected person.

SB 572

(1:45 - 2:15 pm) Modifies protective proceedings to permit vulnerable youth guardianships for adults between 18 and 21 years of age who are eligible for special immigrant status and who are unable to be reunified with parent due to abuse, neglect or abandonment that occurred before adult attained 18 years of age.

SB 186

Approves modifications to rules of Oregon Criminal Justice Commission.

SB 188 A

Clarifies that state felony traffic offenses charged in Multnomah County will be heard in court facility in Portland.

SB = 220

Prescribes formalities for remote attestation of writing.

SB 296 A

Authorizes Chief Justice of Supreme Court, during period of statewide emergency and upon finding of good cause, to extend or suspend time period or time requirement in rule or statute in specified court proceedings.

SB 297

Provides that judicial marshal certified by Department of Public Safety Standards and Training qualifies as police officer under Public Employees Retirement System.
