SB 296 A

Authorizes Chief Justice of Supreme Court, during period of statewide emergency and upon finding of good cause, to extend or suspend time period or time requirement in rule or statute in specified court proceedings.

SB 298

(1:30 - 1:30 pm) Conforms language in provisions relating to stalking protective order to language used in other provisions relating to protective orders.

SJM 2

(1:30 - 2:45 pm) Urges Congress to amend Thirteenth Amendment to United States Constitution to omit clause excepting criminal punishment, thereby ending racist legacy of slavery in nation's most important document.

SJM 4

(1:30 - 2:45 pm) Urges Congress to enact legislation to begin process of implementing reparations for African Americans based on slavery and discrimination.

SJR 10

(1:15 - 2:45 pm) Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to prohibit slavery and involuntary servitude in all circumstances.
