Public Hearing

HB 3284

(3:15 - 4:00 pm) Prohibits covered organization from collecting, using or disclosing personal data about resident individual who has not given affirmative express consent for collection, use or disclosure unless in context of employment relationship or to comply with legal obligation.

Work Session

HB 2177

Authorizes Chief Justice of Supreme Court to collect fees from certain public bodies for use of certain state court technology services.

HB 2204

Provides that public safety officer who represents that person is acting as employee or agent of public body is acting in scope of employment for purposes of Oregon Tort Claims Act.

HB 2482

Removes entering or remaining unlawfully in or on public transit vehicle or public transit station as manner of committing crime of interfering with public transportation.

HB 2523

Directs Department of Transportation to waive driving privilege reinstatement fee if driving privileges were suspended for failing to pay fine.

HB 2547

Directs State Court Administrator to study methods for assigning single judge to domestic relations cases to serve throughout duration of case.

HB 3176

Permits chief administrative law judge to require implied consent hearing to be conducted by telephone or other two-way communication device if judge determines that meeting in person poses significant risk to health or safety.

Neither registration nor use of the public access kiosk is a guarantee that you will be able to testify during the meeting. Committee chairs may determine that public testimony must be limited. For this reason, written testimony is encouraged even if you plan to speak.

Unless otherwise noted on the agenda, testimony is only accepted by committees for bills or topics scheduled for a public hearing. See the Oregon Legislature's website for information on contacting individual legislators directly on bills or topics not scheduled for a public hearing.
