HB 2481

(9:00 am) Prohibits law enforcement agencies from receiving certain military surplus equipment from federal government.

HB 2928

Regulates use of chemical incapacitants, kinetic impact projectiles and sound devices by law enforcement agencies.

HB 2932

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to establish statewide database of reports of use of physical force by peace officers and corrections officers.

HB 3145
