HB 2162

(8:00 - 8:30 am) Directs Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to study changes to police officer training and to provide results of study to Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2021.

#### HB 3059

Repeals statute authorizing law enforcement officers to command dispersal of unlawful assemblies and arrest participants who do not disperse.

#### HB 2931

Requires person who arrests another person to ensure arrested person receives medical assessment.

HB 2932

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to establish statewide database of reports of use of physical force by peace officers and corrections officers.

HB<sup>2986</sup>

Requires Board on Public Safety Standards and Training to ensure that police officers and certified reserve officers are trained to investigate, identify and report crimes motivated by prejudice based on perceived gender of victim.

HB 3164

Modifies crime of interfering with a peace officer or parole and probation officer.

HB 3145

Directs Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to establish publicly available database of certain information about misconduct and discipline of public safety employees established by department.
