Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 2167

(1:05 pm) Directs Office of Governor to study and make recommendations regarding certain proposals relating to state boards and commissions.

Work Session

HB 2681

Requires each county clerk to file annual report with Secretary of State identifying each voter who clerk moved to inactive status during previous calendar year and specifying reason for moving voter to inactive status.

HB 2745

Requires voter registration cards and electronic voter registration system to include option for person to identify race, ethnicity and preferred language of person.

HB 2993

Requires agency to appoint advisory committee to represent interests of persons likely to be affected by proposed rule.

HB 3021

Requires Secretary of State to create and make publicly available list of five most common languages spoken by residents of state.

HB 3110

Requires board of directors of publicly traded corporation to have specified proportion of female directors and directors who are members of underrepresented communities.

- Registration closes at the time the meeting is scheduled to begin.
- A public access kiosk is located outside of the State Capitol Building for anyone without access to a phone or computer to join a meeting by video.

Neither registration nor use of the public access kiosk is a guarantee that you will be able to testify during the meeting. Committee chairs may determine that public testimony must be limited. For this reason, written testimony is encouraged even if you plan to speak.

Unless otherwise noted on the agenda, testimony is only accepted by committees for bills or topics scheduled for a public hearing. See the Oregon Legislature's website for information on contacting individual legislators directly on bills or topics not scheduled for a public hearing.
