HB 2244

(8:10 am) Provides that filing of petition appealing final order in other than contested case issued by Water Resources Commission or Water Resources Department in either circuit court or Court of Appeals may not stay enforcement of order of commission or department that regulated off use of water in favor of determined claim, in-stream water right held by state agency or water right held by, or held in trust for, federally recognized Indian tribe.

HB 2344

(8:20 am) Requires persons that have responsibility for or control over packaging and labeling disposable cleaning cloths or similar implements with specified characteristics to comply with certain labeling requirements for product packaging.

HB 3091 **

HB 3103

(8:40 am) Authorizes holder of water right certificate that allows storage of water to change use of water, subject to certain requirements.

HB 3293

(8:50 am) CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-6-2021 MEETING: Authorizes provider of water project support to make support available to local organizations and local governments for purpose of developing local community engagement plans for water projects.

HB 2144

(9:00 am) Requires Water Resources Department to study laws relating to transfers of, or other changes to, rights to store water.

Public Hearing and Work Session

HB 3166

(9:20 am) Requires Legislative Policy and Research Committee to study and make recommendations to interim committee of Legislative Assembly regarding water measurement program.

Note change: HB 3293 was added. HB 2251 was removed.

- A public access kiosk is located outside of the State Capitol Building for anyone without access to a phone or computer to join a meeting by video.

Neither registration nor use of the public access kiosk is a guarantee that you will be able to testify during the meeting. Committee chairs may determine that public testimony must be limited. For this reason, written testimony is encouraged even if you plan to speak.

Unless otherwise noted on the agenda, testimony is only accepted by committees for bills or topics scheduled for a public hearing. See the Oregon Legislature's website for information on contacting individual legislators directly on bills or topics not scheduled for a public hearing.
