Public Hearing

HB 2433

Directs Legislative Revenue Officer to study state and local tax systems and report findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to revenue no later than September 15, 2022.

HB 2551 A

Extends and modifies tax credits for donations for individual development accounts.

HB 2721

Allows dependent care income tax credit to be claimed for expenses to allow taxpayer or spouse to attend school as enrolled degree-seeking student.

HB 2819 A

Allows otherwise qualified individual to claim earned income tax credit under individual taxpayer identification number in lieu of Social Security number.

HB 3302 A

Creates income or corporate excise tax credit for contributions to workforce training organizations.

HB 2737

Creates subtraction from federal taxable income for amounts received as AmeriCorps national service educational awards, for personal income taxpayers.

SB 102

Exempts from state and local transient lodging taxes military lodging used for temporary overnight human occupancy by active or retired members or service veterans of Armed Forces of the United States or National Guard or by employees or agents of Oregon Military Department.

SB 157

Enacts express sunset for exemption of medical marijuana registry cardholder or primary caregiver from tax imposed on retail sale of marijuana items.

HB 2445

Enacts express sunset for exemption of medical marijuana registry cardholder or primary caregiver from tax imposed on retail sale of marijuana items.
