Public Hearing

SB 602

Removes sunset on requirement that students must receive certain information related to statewide summative assessments.

SB 356

Creates position of School Nurse Specialist in Department of Education.

SB 594

Prohibits school district boards from authorizing, and school districts from using, certain monitoring software related to students' computer usage.

SB 606

Directs Department of Education to conduct study on standardized tests and to report results of study to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to education.

SB 596

Prohibits State Board of Education from requiring, and school districts from administering, certain assessments to students enrolled or preparing to enroll in prekindergarten through grade two.

SB 226

Directs Department of Education to conduct study on education system of state and to report results of study to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to education.

SB 623

Requires local workforce development boards to evaluate programs administered by state workforce agencies through WorkSource Oregon system.

Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to provide grants to nonprofits providing affordable housing to university students.

SB 667

Requires school district to adopt and implement policy concerning ownership rights to teacher-created intellectual property.
