HB 3109 A

Limits certain restrictions by local governments on use of property for child care facilities.

HB 3255 A

Directs education employer to provide materials and assistance to eligible employees concerning public service loan forgiveness program.

HB 3254 A

Directs Department of Education to provide moneys for payment of costs of education of students in qualified treatment programs.

HB 2105 A

Directs school district to provide child with disability and child's parents with information regarding supported decision-making and strategies to remain engaged in child's secondary education and post-school outcomes.

HB 2056

Expands high school diploma requirements related to completion of credits in English to allow completion of credits in language arts.

HB 2697 A

Requires education provider to prohibit display of any symbols of hate on school property or in education program.

HB 3012 A

Limits ability of public university to refuse new mandatory incidental fees or process for collecting mandatory incidental fees.

HB 2542 A

Requires each public university and community college to prominently display mandatory fees charged.

HB 2919 A

Requires each public university and community college to prominently display, or establish link to website that displays, estimated costs of all required course materials and directly related course fees for no less than 75 percent of total for-credit courses offered by public university or community college.

Note change: HB 2697 A, HB 3012 A, HB 2542 A, and HB 2919 A have been added.
