Please note: SB 582 is being heard for the purpose of hearing testimony on an amendment, based on HB 2065, that would replace the language in SB 582. The amendment will be made available on OLIS as soon as possible.

SB 582

Directs Department of Environmental Quality to study and make recommendations for modernizing Oregon's recycling system and provide results of study in report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2022.
