#### **Work Session**

SB 864

Increases maximum percentage of tax that governing body of city or county may impose on sale of marijuana items.

SB 139

Reduces amount of income eligible for elective reduced personal income tax rate allowed for certain pass-through income.

SB 727

Directs Legislative Revenue Officer to study potential legislative methodologies for addressing federal limitation on personal income tax deduction allowed for state and local taxes and report findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to revenue no later than September 15, 2022.

HB 2457 A

Updates connection date to federal Internal Revenue Code and other provisions of federal tax law.

HB 2247 A

Authorizes county to adopt ordinance or resolution authorizing waiver of interest charged for failure to pay taxes when due.

HB 2331 A

Excludes from meaning of "communication," for purposes of central assessment for property taxation, services of television and radio stations licensed by Federal Communications

## AGENDA (cont.) June 14, 2021

Commission that use primarily earth-based transmitters to broadcast programming via radio waves to television or radio receivers that use indoor or outdoor antennas for reception.

HB 2343 B

Authorizes governing body of enterprise zone sponsor to adopt resolution suspending enterprise zone employment requirements otherwise imposed on authorized business firms for either or both of property tax years beginning on July 1, 2021, and July 1, 2022.

HB 3275 B

Exempts land owned by eligible covenant holder that is burdened by affordable housing covenant, requiring affordability for at least 99 years, from ad valorem property taxation if improvements on land constitute owner-occupied housing.
