Work Session

SB 557

Establishes COFA Dental Program in Oregon Health Authority to provide dental care to lowincome citizens of Pacific Islands in Compact of Free Association who reside in Oregon and lack access to affordable dental coverage.

SB

Includes as unlawful practice medical provider's denial of treatment that is likely to benefit patient based on patient's race, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age or disability.

SB 641

Prohibits denial of medical assistance on basis that individual under 19 years of age is in detention pending adjudication.

SB706

> Requires Oregon Health Authority to provide grant to organization for purpose of conducting outreach to citizens of island nations in Compact of Free Association residing in Oregon to enroll citizens of island nations in Compact of Free Association in medical assistance.

Public Hearing

SB 12

Requires benefit plans offered by Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board to cover certain costs related to travel to Mexico or Canada to fill and refill prescriptions.

SB 168

Requires health benefit plans to cover fertility and reproductive endocrinology services.

SB 758

Changes "Oregon Medical Marijuana Act" to "Oregon Medical and Therapeutic Cannabis Act." Allows person designated to produce marijuana by registry identification cardholder to enter into agreement with registry identification cardholder to transfer marijuana to another registry identification cardholder or primary caregiver.

SB 781

Modifies provisions relating to providing results of tests to patients.

SB 684

Establishes Task Force on Oregon Medical Board.
