Work Session

SB 558

Prohibits insurance policy or contract that provides coverage for prescription drug to require prescription for drug to be filled or refilled at mail order pharmacy or to prohibit prescription from being filled or refilled at local pharmacy.

SB 560

Requires insurer and health care service contractor to count payments made on behalf of enrollee for costs of care toward enrollee's out-of-pocket maximum or cost-sharing.

SB 584

Requires Oregon Health Authority to provide medical assistance to employed individuals with disabilities without regard to individuals' income or resources.

SB 748

Requires Public Employees' Benefit Board, Oregon Educators Benefit Board and private insurers to provide insurance coverage to adult disabled children and adult disabled siblings of insureds under certain circumstances.

SB 758

Changes "Oregon Medical Marijuana Act" to "Oregon Medical and Therapeutic Cannabis Act."
Allows person designated to produce marijuana by registry identification cardholder to enter into

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agreement with registry identification cardholder to transfer marijuana to another registry identification cardholder or primary caregiver.

SB 12

Requires benefit plans offered by Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board to cover certain costs related to travel to Mexico or Canada to fill and refill prescriptions.

SB 719

Provides that certain aggregate data relating to reportable disease investigations are not confidential or exempt from disclosure under public records law unless data could reasonably lead to identification of individual.

Public Hearing

SB 800

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study and make recommendations to interim committees of Legislative Assembly, no later than September 15, 2022, for legislative changes needed to increase access to health care for all Oregonians.

SB 674

Requires Oregon Health Authority to investigate best practices and latest technology and to establish hospital procedures to enable family members to visit hospitalized patients during pandemic.

SB 772

Requires individual and group health insurance policies to reimburse services provided by naturopathic physicians within scope of their practice if services are reimbursed when provided by licensed physicians.

Note change: SB 700 and SB 741 have been removed. SB 800 has been added.

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reason, written testimony is encouraged even if you plan to speak.

Unless otherwise noted on the agenda, testimony is only accepted by committees for bills or topics scheduled for a public hearing. See the Oregon Legislature's website for information on contacting individual legislators directly on bills or topics not scheduled for a public hearing.
