Public Hearing

SB 772

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/31/2021 AGENDA: Requires individual and group health insurance policies to reimburse services provided by naturopathic physicians within scope of their practice if services are reimbursed when provided by licensed physicians.

SB 772 is scheduled solely for the purpose of hearing testimony from those who were unable to speak at the 3/31/2021 meeting.

SB 684

Establishes Task Force on Oregon Medical Board.

Work Session

SB 705

Adds two members who are physician assistants or retired physician assistants to membership of Oregon Medical Board.

SB 610

Creates psychology provider incentive program within Oregon Health Authority to provide financial incentives to students enrolled in approved doctoral programs in psychology who complete courses that provide cultural competency training.

AGENDA (cont.) April 5, 2021

SB 168

Requires health benefit plans to cover fertility and reproductive endocrinology services.

SB 800

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study and make recommendations to interim committees of Legislative Assembly, no later than September 15, 2022, for legislative changes needed to increase access to health care for all Oregonians.

SB 850

Requires that report of death indicate housing status of decedent.

SB 763

Provides that person may not engage in business as pharmaceutical representative without obtaining license from Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services.

SB 764

Provides that Attorney General and court must presume that resolution agreement that ends dispute over alleged infringement of patent or violation of other protection for protected drug has anticompetitive effects if alleged infringer receives item of value as part of or in connection with resolution agreement or if alleged infringer agrees to limit or stop researching, developing, manufacturing, marketing or selling competing drug.

SB 844

Establishes Prescription Drug Affordability Board in Department of Consumer and Business Services to review prices for prescription drug products meeting specified cost criteria.

SB 848

Establishes Office of Pharmaceutical Purchasing in Oregon Health Authority and specifies duties.

SB 629

Allows pharmacist to use telepharmacy to deliver pharmacy services to patient at remote location.

SB 157 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Tax Expenditures

Enacts express sunset for exemption of medical marijuana registry cardholder or primary

fracts express sunset for exemption of medical marijuana registry cardholder or primary caregiver from tax imposed on retail sale of marijuana items.

SB 12

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/31/2021 AGENDA: Requires benefit plans offered by Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board to cover certain costs related to travel to Mexico or Canada to fill and refill prescriptions.

SB 719

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/31/2021 AGENDA: Provides that certain aggregate data relating to reportable disease investigations are not confidential or exempt from disclosure under public records law unless data could reasonably lead to identification of individual.

SB 748

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/31/2021 AGENDA: Requires Public Employees' Benefit Board, Oregon Educators Benefit Board and private insurers to provide insurance coverage to adult disabled children and adult disabled siblings of insureds under certain circumstances.

SB 758

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 3/31/2021 AGENDA: Changes "Oregon Medical Marijuana Act" to "Oregon Medical and Therapeutic Cannabis Act." Allows person designated to produce marijuana by registry identification cardholder to enter into agreement with registry identification cardholder to transfer marijuana to another registry identification cardholder or primary caregiver.
