Work Session

SB 781

Modifies provisions relating to providing results of tests to patients.

SB 800

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/5/2021 AGENDA: Requires Oregon Health Authority to study and make recommendations to interim committees of Legislative Assembly, no later than September 15, 2022, for legislative changes needed to increase access to health care for all Oregonians.

SB 719

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/5/2021 AGENDA: Provides that certain aggregate data relating to reportable disease investigations are not confidential or exempt from disclosure under public records law unless data could reasonably lead to identification of individual.

SB 758

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/5/2021 AGENDA: Changes "Oregon Medical Marijuana Act" to "Oregon Medical and Therapeutic Cannabis Act." Allows person designated to produce marijuana by registry identification cardholder to enter into agreement with registry identification cardholder to transfer marijuana to another registry identification cardholder or primary caregiver.

SB 705

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/7/2021 AGENDA: Adds two members who are physician assistants or retired physician assistants to membership of Oregon Medical Board.
