Work Session

HB 2550 A

Directs seller's agent to redact or withhold communication from buyer to seller as necessary to help seller avoid selecting buyer based on buyer's race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, marital status or familial status, in violation of federal fair housing laws.

HB 2605 A

Imposes tsunami design standards for certain buildings and other structures.

HB 3322 A

Allows production of food in planned community by lot owners and their tenants.

HB 2736 A

Requires landlords to provide tenants with informational notice developed by Bureau of Labor and Industries regarding discrimination upon execution of rental agreement on or after January 1, 2022, or for existing rental agreements by February 1, 2022.

HB 3124 A

Increases time that written notice must be posted before removal of homeless individuals from established camping site.
