Public Hearing

SB 135

Authorizes disclosure of child abuse investigation reports and records to Oregon Youth Authority.

SB 84

Directs Department of Human Services to prepare report regarding Strengthening, Preserving and Reunifying Families programs and make recommendations for legislation.

SB 85

Modifies family-based group home placements to permit respite time for providers.

SB 562

Declares that person may not be disqualified from service as child welfare service provider based on certain traits.
