Public Hearing

SB 515

Requires employee of certain licensed premises who is permittee to make report if permittee has reasonable belief that sex trafficking is occurring at premises or that minor is employed or contracted as performer at premises in manner violating Oregon Liquor Control Commission rules.

SB 535

Modifies child abuse reporting requirements to add hotelkeepers and innkeepers as mandatory reporters of child abuse.

Work Session

SB 135

Authorizes disclosure of child abuse investigation reports and records to Oregon Youth Authority.

February 25, 2021

SB 562

Declares that person may not be disqualified from service as child welfare service provider based on certain traits.

SB 555

Requires Department of Human Services to contract with nonprofit organization to implement and administer program to assist recipients of supplemental nutrition assistance in purchasing locally grown fruits and vegetables from farmers' markets, farm share sites and retail outlets that participate in program.

Please note: the following bill is scheduled solely for the purpose of moving it back to the Senate President's desk for referral to a different committee.

SB 708

Prohibits placement of youths in private youth correction facilities.
