#### Public Hearing

SB 97

Prohibits Residential Facilities Ombudsman, designee of ombudsman or staff of ombudsman from being compelled to testify or produce documents related to complaint in any judicial or administrative proceeding.

SB 66

Directs medical examiner to report suspected suicides involving decedents 24 years of age or younger to local mental health authority.

SB 563

Modifies laws relating to youth suicide intervention and prevention to include children 5 to 10 years of age.

SB 682

Establishes Adult Suicide Intervention and Prevention Coordinator within Oregon Health Authority.
