#### Public Hearing

SB 220

Prescribes formalities for remote attestation of writing.

SB 221

Modifies court procedure for determining whether decedent intended writing to be decedent's will, partial or complete revocation of decedent's will or addition to or alteration of decedent's will.

SB 728

Modifies provisions of law relating to administration of decedents' estates.

SB 175

Allows certain assistant attorneys general to use employment address on certain records maintained by Department of Transportation.

SB 188

Clarifies that state felony traffic offenses charged in Multnomah County will be heard in court facility in Portland.

#### **Work Session**

SB 554

Authorizes city, county, metropolitan service district, port operating commercial airport, school district, college or university to adopt ordinance or policy limiting or precluding affirmative defense for possession of firearms in public buildings by concealed handgun licensees.
