SB 180

Requires insurer to notify claimant upon paying \$5,000 or more to settle third-party liability claim if claimant is natural person and if insurer or insurer's agent or other representative, including insurer's attorney, delivers payment to claimant or to claimant's attorney, agent or other representative by draft, check or other form of payment.

SB 183

Provides procedure for recognition and enforcement of orders and judgments of tribal courts in courts of this state.

SB 768

Modifies provisions relating to attorneys.

- SB 829
 - Clarifies rights of possession of real property following execution sales.
- SB 501

Increases criminal and civil penalties for subsequent and intentional violations of specified election laws.
