SJM 2

SB 571

Allows persons convicted of felony to register to vote, update voter registration and vote in elections while incarcerated.

Please note: SB 571 is scheduled solely for the purpose of taking testimony from persons originally signed up to testify at the public hearing held on 2/24/21.

SB 618

Directs Oregon Department of Administrative Services to study methods of providing reparations for slavery to Black Oregonians and report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2022.

- SB 619 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Finance and Revenue Directs Department of Revenue to establish program to pay reparations to Black Oregonians who can demonstrate heritage in slavery and who submit application no later than December 31, 2022.
- SB 620

Provides that monthly supervision fee for person under supervision of community corrections program is not automatically required, but may be required by program.

SB 651

Provides that probationer or probationer's attorney may file objection to proposed modification to special conditions of probation.

SJM 4

Urges Congress to enact legislation to begin process of implementing reparations for African Americans based on slavery and discrimination.

SB 603

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study establishment of Innocence Commission and system to compensate wrongfully convicted persons, and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2021.

SB 620

Provides that monthly supervision fee for person under supervision of community corrections program is not automatically required, but may be required by program.

SB 651

Provides that probationer or probationer's attorney may file objection to proposed modification to special conditions of probation.
