### **Public Hearing**

SB 209

Allows owner of interest held in financial institution or holder of traveler's check or money order to demonstrate lack of abandonment by electronic communication or other records by institution or issuer.

SB 213

Voids certain provisions in construction agreement requiring design professional to defend or indemnify against certain claims except to extent design professional's negligence caused indemnitee's damages.

SB 565

Modifies definition of "slayer" to include individuals who are found responsible or guilty except for insanity of taking person's life.

SB 72

Modifies circumstances in which physician or provider may disregard principal's wishes regarding mental health treatment to include when principal is extremely dangerous person committed to Oregon Health Authority.

#### **Work Session**

SB 187

Defines "dangerous to self or others" for purpose of taking person with mental illness into custody.

SB 189

Requires outpatient care as condition for trial visit of person committed to custody of Oregon Health Authority as person with mental illness.

SB 190

Modifies permissible methods of providing notice of appointment of guardian to protected person.

SB 220

Prescribes formalities for remote attestation of writing.

SB 765

Makes permanent provisions allowing notary public to perform notarial act using communication technology for remotely located individual under certain circumstances.

SB 201

Provides that person commits offense of driving while under influence of intoxicants if person has blood alcohol level of 0.08 percent or more by weight within two hours after driving vehicle.

SB 483

Creates rebuttable presumption that person violated prohibition against retaliation or discrimination against employee or prospective employee if person takes certain action against employee or prospective employee within 60 days after employee or prospective employee has engaged in certain protected activities.
