Work Session

SB 216

Exempts from criminal liability person who records conversation during or regarding commission of crime, attempted crime or solicitation to commit crime, against person, household member or certain relatives of person.

SB 421

Transfers responsibility for database about police officers from Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to Department of Justice.

SB 613

Provides that arbitral determinations made in proceedings concerning alleged misconduct by law enforcement officers concerning use of excessive force are nonbinding and subject to review and approval by Department of Public Safety Standards and Training.

SB 766

Modifies date of expiration of sexual abuse restraining order for orders entered when petitioner was under 18 years of age.

SB 823

Specifies procedures for providing notice to defendant in charging instrument and at arraignment when conviction would result in firearm prohibition.

SB 841 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Justice for purposes of funding Environmental Crimes and Cultural Resources Enforcement Unit of department.

SB 218

Expands types of charges eligible for conditional discharge to include any misdemeanor or Class C felony if defendant has been accepted into specialty court.

SB 708

Prohibits placement of youths in private youth correction facilities.

SB 751

Requires party in criminal case to provide hard copy or electronic copy of discovery material to adverse party unless copy cannot reasonably be provided.
