HB 3307

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/19/21 AGENDA: Clarifies that intergovernmental entity may seek to obtain any benefits from any public or private entity that any unit of local government or American Indian tribe that is party to intergovernmental agreement may seek to obtain.

HB 2481 A

Prohibits law enforcement agencies from receiving certain military surplus equipment from federal government.

HB 2523 A

Directs Department of Transportation to waive driving privilege reinstatement fee if driving privileges were suspended for certain traffic offenses.

HB 2539

Provides that juror may not be identified by name in court proceeding open to public.

HB 3140

Makes changes to statutes related to operating vehicle or boat while under influence of intoxicants that reference controlled substances to clarify applicability to psilocybin.

HB 3047 A

Establishes civil cause of action for improper disclosure of personal information.
