HB 2030

Modifies provisions relating to advocacy commissions.

HB 2172 A

Expands eligibility for earned reduction in supervision to include persons on any type of supervision who are not serving sentence for disqualifying crime.

HB 2214 A

Limits amount that may be paid to outside attorneys hired by state government.

HB 2459 A

Includes in definition of "conversation" communication occurring through video conferencing program for purposes of statutes regulating recording of communications.

HB 2513 A

Requires police officers to be trained in airway and circulatory anatomy and physiology and certified in cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

HB 2929 A

Modifies police officer's duty to report misconduct.

HB 2936 A

States legislative findings about racism and public safety.

# AGENDA (cont.) May 24, 2021

#### HB 3115

Provides that local law regulating sitting, lying, sleeping or keeping warm and dry outdoors on public property that is open to public must be objectively reasonable as to time, place and manner with regards to persons experiencing homelessness.

## HB 3273 A

Prohibits law enforcement agency from releasing booking photo except in specified circumstances.

Note change: HB 2030 and HB 2513 A added.
