SB 828  
Makes certain findings concerning effects of poor forest management.

#### **Public Hearing and Possible Work Session**

SB 335  
Requires State Forestry Department to study and make recommendations to interim committee of Legislative Assembly regarding operation of State Board of Forestry.

SB 337  
Requires State Forestry Department to study and make recommendations to interim committee of Legislative Assembly regarding efficacy of forest policy.

SB 745  
Provides alternative criteria for domestic water supply district located in area covered by major disaster declaration related to September 2020 wildfires to exercise powers of sanitary district.

SJM 3

Urges establishment and funding of federal system to reimburse state and local government property owners and private property owners for damage to real property that results from spreading of wildfires originating on federal lands.

SB 792

Exempts from disclosure as public record personally identifiable information about child under age of 16 years that is submitted to State Fish and Wildlife Commission or agent of commission to obtain license, tag or permit under wildlife laws.

SB 794

Establishes fee differential for nonresident users of areas established and maintained by State Parks and Recreation Department and relating to recreational vehicles.

SB 795

Confers authority on State Parks and Recreation Commission to adopt fee differential for nonresident users of areas established and maintained by State Parks and Recreation Department.

SB 21

Directs State Fish and Wildlife Commission to develop and adopt by rule invasive grass pilot program in Phillip W. Schneider Wildlife Area.

***Note change: SB 248, and SB 287 have been removed. SB 762 has been rescheduled to 4/5/2021 and 4/7/2021. SB 335, SB 337, SB 745, SJM 3, SB 792, SB 794, SB 795, and SB 21 have been added.***
