Public Hearing

HB 2244 A

Provides that, if Water Resources Commission or Water Resources Department denies stay of final order under certain circumstances and petitioner requests hearing on denial, court must hold hearing not more than 21 days after request is made and denial shall remain in effect until hearing has been held and court has issued decision concerning denial.

HB 2284 A

Establishes Oregon Hemp Commission.

HB 3185 A

Prohibits spreading of material in undisturbed wetlands during maintenance of agricultural channels.

HB 2031 A

Modifies definition of "pesticide applicator." Adds violations of federal law to reasons for which State Department of Agriculture may revoke, suspend or refuse to issue pesticide license or certificate.

HB 2837

Removes designation of rural reserves from private road commonly known as Lasich Lane in Washington County.

HB 3191 A

Directs State Fish and Wildlife Commission to adopt certain requirements related to carcasses of returning hatchery fish.

Note change: HB 2031 A, HB 2837, and HB 3191 A have been added.
