Public Hearing

SB 363 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Military Department for distribution to counties for purpose of acquiring analog encoders for transmission of information to broadcasters in case of emergency.

SB 790

Provides that portion of U.S. Highway 30 in Oregon shall also be known as Oregon Veterans Memorial Highway.

Work Session

SB 288

Directs Department of State Police to expand existing interagency coordination efforts for responding to emergencies to include community-based and faith-based organizations that provide emergency response services to specified communities.

SB 296

Authorizes Chief Justice of Supreme Court, during period of statewide emergency and upon finding of good cause, to extend or suspend time period or time requirement in rule or statute in specified court proceedings.

SB 441

Modifies criteria for erecting roadside memorial signs for deceased veterans who were formerly prisoners of war or unaccounted for.

SCR 15

Recognizes and honors Lance Corporal Jack Ryan Ostrovsky (1999-2020) for his service to his country.

Register to testify live remotely:

- Registration is required to testify by phone or video.

- Registration closes at the time the meeting is scheduled to begin.
- A public access kiosk is located outside of the State Capitol Building for anyone without access to a phone or computer to join a meeting by video.

Neither registration nor use of the public access kiosk is a guarantee that you will be able to testify during the meeting. Committee chairs may determine that public testimony must be limited. For this reason, written testimony is encouraged even if you plan to speak.

Unless otherwise noted on the agenda, testimony is only accepted by committees for bills or topics scheduled for a public hearing. See the Oregon Legislature's website for information on contacting individual legislators directly on bills or topics not scheduled for a public hearing.
